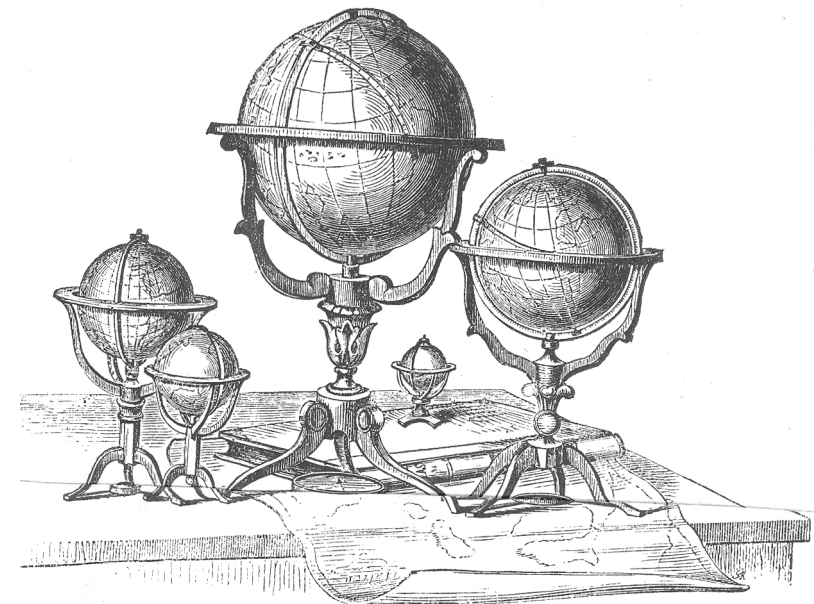

Jena, September 29 to October 1, 2011



12th INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM FOR THE STUDY OF GLOBES 2011

The 12th International Symposium for the Study of Globes will take place in Jena (Germany), September 29 to October 1, 2011. The symposium is organised by the International Coronelli Society for the Study of Globes in co-operation with the Ernst-Haeckel-Haus, the Institute for the History of Science, Medicine and Technology at the Friedrich Schiller University, Jena (Germany).

Jena, a science centre of international repute, is located in Thüringen. When talking of the study of globes, Jena has its share of history having made famous by the mathematics professor and astronomer Erhard Weigel (1625-1699) from Weiden in der Oberpfalz. Among his other creations, Weigel's 'heraldic' celestial globes are noteworthy, in which he replaced the traditional constellations with the coats of arms and symbols of European dynasties. His memento is kept by the Erhard Weigel Society based in Jena. There are numerous value for money hotels close to the venue, a fact which further justifies Jena as an appropriate venue for the meeting.

Weimar, a city famous internationally for its cultural inheritance (Goethe, Herder, Schiller, Wieland), is only a twenty-minute train ride from Jena. Weimar's *Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek* managed by the *Klassik Stiftung Weimar* has an excellent collection of twenty-seven old globes. The exhibition "The World from Weimar – The history of the Geographical Institute" in the *Bertuchhaus*, the current city museum of Weimar, is another attraction that you might want to visit.

Themes of the symposium are all aspects of the study of globes, especially the history of globes, globes in their historical and socio-cultural context, globe makers, especially Erhard Weigel and the globes made by the Geographical Institute Weimar, globe related instruments such as armillary spheres, planetaria and telluria.

PROGRAMME

The programme of the 12th International Symposium for the Study of Globes has now largely been fixed.

Seats have been reserved in the restaurant "Stilbruch", Wagnergasse 1&2, 07743 Jena (<http://www.stilbruch-jena.de>) for an informal meeting to be held on Wednesday, September 28 (arrival date) in the evening.

The symposium will take place in the *Rosensäle* [Rose Salons] of the Friedrich Schiller University Jena, Fürstengraben 27, 07743 Jena, and will be opened at 10 am on Thursday, September 29. However, the symposium office will be open from 9 am.

The presentation programme drawn up by the programme committee comprises 20 talks to be held over Thursday, September 29 and Friday, September 30. You will find the provisional presentation programme attached to this circular.

The organisers will provide refreshments during the breaks; these are included in the symposium fee. Lunch can be taken in the nearby restaurants during the midday break.

On Thursday, September 29, at 7 p.m. the *Ernst Abbe Stiftung* invites all participants to a guided tour through the unique Optical Museum (Optisches Museum, Carl-Zeiß-Platz 12, 07743 Jena).

After the symposium closes on Friday, September 30, members of the International Coronelli Society for the Study of Globes will get together for the General Assembly of 2011. Afterwards, all symposium participants will meet at 8 pm to enjoy an evening meal in the traditional, stylish restaurant "Zur Noll", Oberlauengasse 19, 07743 Jena (<http://www.zur-noll.de>). The cost of this meal is included in the symposium fee.

On Saturday, October 1, we will take a trip to Weimar. Participants can travel to Weimar either separately by car or together by train; we will meet up at 10 am in Weimar. The day will start with a guided tour of the exhibition "The World from Weimar – the History of the Geographical Institute" at the City Museum, followed by a guided tour of the *Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek* with special attention being paid to its valuable globe collection. This will end at approx. 1 pm.

Lunch will be taken individually. Weimar has plenty of restaurants in various price categories.

In the afternoon, those interested are invited to take part in a workshop with the title "Globenbibliographie" [Globe Bibliography], to be held (in German) at the City Museum at 3 pm; others can join guided tours of the city offered in German and English. Prepared and chaired by Markus Heinz, the workshop aims to discuss the terminology used to describe globes, focusing on globe production from the 19th century onwards.

The costs of the group rail trip to Weimar, the visits of the City Museum and the *Herzogin Anna Amalia Bibliothek* and the guided tours there are included in the symposium fee; however, the fee does not cover the costs of the guided tours of the city.
